

# Holiday Decorating

### With East Hampton Gardens' Michael Giannelli

ichael Giannelli, proprietor of East Hampton Gardens, is a master of holiday decorating. He gave us a peek into Holiday 2022 and his vision of style this year is silver tinsel-wrapped in nostalgia.

### Jack Frost

"This is a winter wonderland of snowy whites and shimmer that brings elegance to your tree, interiors, and tabletop," he explained. "Frosted trees twinkling with lights, silver garlands, and vintage ornaments are the focus. Antique silver glitter covers pine cones and accents of crystal icicles, glittery blown glass ornaments are grouped together in a wintery scene. Pastel-colored cottages finished with glitter sparkle under the tree or placed on a console with antique white and gold miniature trees to set a frosty holiday mood. Take out all your vintage silver pieces and accents and display them around your home filled with ornaments, greens, or candy. Frosted garlands are placed on mantles with crystal and silver candle sticks and everything shimmers in a layer of glitter."

### Woodland Wonderland

"Here we use natural elements that bring the outdoors inside. A large quirky tree with plenty of branches for ornaments that are burnished and have a patina," continued Giannelli. "Large magnolia branches in vases used on console tables or mantles. Mixed garlands of pine, cedar, and magnolia draped on the staircase. A large wreath of pine cones, large and small, mixed with juniper berries. A large bow of shimmering organza finishes it off. Beautiful birds in all varieties are tucked into the tree, garlands, and wreaths as a surprise element. Garlands are laid on the dining tables with pillar candles, votives, glittery deer, and pine cones. Napkins are wrapped with simple jute with greens tucked in."

a shelf, and keep the groups bundled close together, rather than spread out."

To decorate a tree Giannelli recommends starting with lights, working from the inside of the boughs outward to the tips. Whatever styling has been chosen for the rest of the house can be extended to the tree. He prefers the slow-twinkling white lights with the formula: "for each three-foot tree we'll use 60 feet of lights." Giannelli recommends boughs of greenery draped on the mantel, twisted down the banister of the staircase, or curled into a centerpiece surrounding a candle on the festive table.

"There are a few ways for you to use ribbon on your Christmas tree," he explained. "I'd particularly like to use a four-inchwide wired ribbon. I also look for doublesided ribbons so sometimes they have a plaid, on one side and a gingham, on the other or contrasting patterns, which makes the tree more interesting. The first way you can use the ribbon is to start at the top of the tree and secure the ribbon with floral wire to a branch then working vertically you loop the ribbon and tuck it into the tree and you work your way down the Christmas tree looping the ribbon to the left or to the right to create movement, you can also use this technique by going around the Christmas tree. I use the back of my hand to help make the loop and then tuck it into the tree and secure it with wire. You can also make multiple loops almost like a half bow at the top of the tree and then give yourself another 12 inches of ribbon and into the tree, then create sort of three little loops and tuck those into the tree. The trick to using ribbon on a Christmas tree is I usually keep the ribbon on the spool and

"This is our nod to a classic, more traditional Christmas," Giannelli said. "A large, classic tree filled with white lights, red, green, and silver beaded garlands, and painted plaid ornaments in glass, candy canes, and peppermints in apothecary jars on mantles and tables. Vintage-inspired ornaments hang in mass on the tree finished with retro tinsel that sparkles. Satin tartan tree skirts and stockings add to the traditional mix. Tartan ribbons are woven in garlands and finish a beautiful wreath layered with greens, pine cones, and winterberry. Our signature red satin bows are placed on boxwood wreaths inside and out. Tables are set with a mix of heirloom china and grandma's crystal glasses, and napkins are finished with dress pleats and are tucked into silver napkin rings. Boxwood topiaries are placed in small silver containers to add shimmer and reflect the candle's glow."

How does Giannelli incorporate these styles and holiday looks into client homes? He applies the classic principles of design to holiday décor methodically within a reverse engineered philosophy. "We use a lot of what clients have, and then add or subtract."

He says that according to his classic design principle, groups of three are ideal although groupings in general help create an impact. Giannelli recommends gathering similar items together for a holiday display. For example, an effortless way to create this is with a congregation of candles on a table or sideboard. "Put mini-trees, like a small forest, together on use the entire length of ribbon while I'm working because I don't want to pre-cut the ribbon because eventually, you'll run out so if I'm working from the top of the Christmas tree down, I would make the loops continuously working left to right and then when I get to the bottom of the tree, I would leave a tail and then continue again starting at the top."

Painting A Modern Oasis In Amagansett Dunes with a three-dimensional wall sculpture by local artist Sydney Butchkes to bring form and texture to the home in a restrained way," Frampton continued. "A variety of ceramic works, from various objet to a handmade raku wall installation, complete the experience."

The standout chandelier art piece above the stark glass-enclosed modern staircase is by Dominick Leuci called the Eques Series LED Sculpture No. 4, USA, 2018. It incorporates a mirror-polished nickelplated brass body with 19 mirror polished stainless steel plumes and sits across the Ted Kuhara piece entitled "Double Blue" work, Verlaine's Dream Painting, acrylic on canvas from 1970 is by Michael Boyd.

The primary bedroom highlights a setting by JOHNHOUSHMAND with the walnut slab headboard that incorporates an angled base, integral drawers plus its incorporated side tables over the naturalistic wool and silk, handknotted rug from Nepal by Atelier Fevrier. The walls feature the Drop System 3 sconces by Lindsey Adelman and artwork by Esteban Vicente. Textiles on the stunning bed are by Avenue Road.

No detail was missed in the bathrooms,

globes with brushed brass connectors and white canopy.

The cabana bathroom features sconces in satin nickel finish and frosted lens by Juniper. Subway ceramic tile, train azul gloss crackle by Artistic Tile. The Penny tile in the shower by Waterworks is paired with hardware in color 04 light blue by Vola.

The piece de resistance of the home is the full incorporation of outdoor living. The bold weave in custom blue ombre by Shore continues the blue accent color among natural tones. A custom sectional called the Marbella Teak Luxe Modular U Sofa makes for memorable summer nights as it cocoons their Malay Cast Concrete Tables both produced by Restoration Hardware. The finishing touches are the Otto Rope Poufs by DDC, a lounge chair in cool taupe by Dedon and earthenware with glaze sidetables by Sereny & Lily.

lena Frampton is a master at bringing to life her clients' vision, whether it involves maximalist flourishes or a peaceful contemporary. The common denominator throughout her twenty year career is her deep understanding of how art and interiors need each other. Frampton says she continues and loves to learn, in fact she has taught at Parsons School of Design and is a committee member of the Parrish Contemporaries Circle at the Parrish Art Museum. Art is a priority in everything she does and she designs with a painterly mastery.

A stunning oceanfront modern masterstroke in the Amagansett Dunes was the perfect canvas for someone like Frampton who understood the assignment: create a visually calm oasis to complement its tranquil setting. Built by modern masters, Consiglio Builders, the Barnes Coy designed modern was finished with landscaping by the LaGuardia Design Group.

The 5,200-square-foot, six-bedroom home fully incorporates the famous Hamptons light as well as the blue hues that seep into the atmosphere from the ocean a stone's throw away. The neutral palette with touches of sky blue in the form of furniture pieces blended into the baseline of the beige and gray color story. Frampton, instead of her usual maximalist inclinations, worked with texture to create depth in the form of wood slatting.

Upon entry, the floating stairs in teak and steel with glass enclosure sets the stage for clean tranquility. Sydney Butchkes acrylic on shaped canvas and wood from 1985 hangs above Petra console table in gray oak finish by Amorph. Plaster walls are by Marmocarrara. Under it all is the naturalistic shag rug by Woven.

"The modern cedar, glass, stone, aluminum, and steel beach house features an 'upside-down' layout with the living areas upper level to take advantage of the ocean views," explained Frampton. "Embracing the irregularity of the home's angles, we utilized rounded, organic, and sculptural furnishings throughout, including many custom items like the organic shaped dining table and geometric rug in the main living area. What appears to be an easygoing, zen-like environment is the result of many careful studies."

The informal dining area is flooded by light and features Hola chairs by Hannes Wettstein in polyurethane padded upholstery with an inner steel core with pale blue fabric from Cassina, from 2003. They surround the stunning and bold custom walnut and resin tabletop with walnut and steel legs by Stacklab. The seven light catch suspension chandelier is designed by Lindsey Adelman.

"We selected strong, minimalist artworks by Ted Kurahara and Michael Boyd, along

#### from 1982.

The minimalist kitchen is the flawless canvas for seasonal flourishes like fruits and flowers. The deep mustard colored bar stools by Alo stool by Massimo Iosa Ghini with their moulded bent beech and poplar plywood shell, revolving chrome finish base, and Pelle Frau leather upholstery act as the accent to the wood and gray color story.

The living quarters hints at a MadMen era of mid-century modernity but with the luxury of today with the Dan Pollack table in white ash wood which evokes as artistic as a Noguchi. The piece is surrounded by a Flexform sectional and lit by the Oslo alabaster LED pendant on three individual fixings with light bronze plates and leather straps by Atelier Alain Ellouz.

In the family room we see the soft shapes of the Mesa round side table, Cloud Modular classic sofa in Belgian linen all by Restoration Hardware. The Trifecta tables by Christian Woo in white washed ash and matte white oil finish add to the softened edges of the room. The plaster wall treatment is by Marmorino Venetian Plasters USA. The minimalist art-



where the hues are consistent throughout. A freestanding tub in acrylic with white gloss by Blu Bathworks is the standout of the room with its single-lever tub mixer on a riser for its freestanding installation with hand shower set by Dornbracht. Illuminating the room is the chandelier that feels like the bubbles of a bubblebath of the Bolle Collection manufactured by Giopato and Coombes. Its spheres are made of transparent borosilicate glass

# Mark Zeff

# Old Fashioned And New Colliding

ark Zeff, whose namesake started 25 years ago, goes officially by MARKZEFF, and he heralds an international, multi-disciplinary, full-service, design firm based in New York City. When we say multi-disciplinary, we mean just that — the company employs architects, interior designers, graphic designers, and brand managers. Zeff started out as a residential designer and grew it into one of the nation's leading design powerhouses. The strength of his residential design expanded into commercial design and branding for which he has won many awards. Lucky for us, the Hamptons is a place where the greats, like Zeff, plant roots, ultimately finding themselves having a love affair with the region.

Mark, you won The International Hotel & Property Award for 2022 – congratulations! Can you explain for which project you won it?

I won best boutique hotel world wide for the Alila Maria Hotel, a Hyatt resort brand, that we designed in Encitinas, California. We also won best restaurant in a hotel world-wide for the Varga restaurant in that hotel.

Your work encompasses such amazing commercial projects, like renown restaurants, spas, hotels, and more. You also design stunning residential properties, for celebrities like Hilary Swank and other clients, with some in the Hamptons. We especially love your own home on the East End, which you named is all on me — a true patience building lifelong experience. We subbed out the entire project to a great team of subcontractors that I still work with to this day.

We love BLACKBARN's very personal expressive style while remaining very true to the East End landscape. The interior has touches of international worldliness mixed with a farmhouse vibe. As the designer, how would you describe its style?

I am a collector at heart, so most everything is collected over the years. My wife and I had many of these items in storage so we really built the house around these personal treasures. Mixing styles is my passion as it really inspires my sense of color, shape, irony, sensuality, etc. These elements all come to play a role. Not sure what to call this style so maybe it's IRONIC.

You have put a lot of emphasis on outdoor living in the build. Can you explain your modus operandi and how your friends and family enjoy it?

This is so important to me — we have kids and dogs so I created a series of outdoor courtyards, one being our extension to the house and is our outdoor living room. This enables the activities inside to meld with what is happening outside seamlessly, which includes cooking, playing, and just doing nothing. There is a pool courtyard as well as an entry courtyard — this idea is borrowed from traditional country houses in the 17th and 18th century.

How did your firm deal



### BLACKBARN. Where did the name come from?

I designed the house using the old Hamptons barn vernacular as an inspiration. I feel that the historic structures out here are really beautiful in their simplicity. The idea of a modern interpretation of the classic barn has always been a go to design aesthetic for me when designing houses in the Hamptons. I designed my first contemporary barn in Sagaponack and this was back in 2005. Since then I have continued to follow this passion to this day.

My modern farmhouse was built in 2014 and at that time black was unheard of to use the way we did. As a personal color that I love, my wife and I decided to experiment on painting our house black. What is wonderful about this color is how it blends into the landscaping and enhances the surroundings.

We nicknamed the house BLACKBARN and then went on to use this name for our BLACKBARN brand.

# What are some of your favorite elements of the design for BLACKBARN?

Concrete floors are super organic and accentuate the architecture and interior elements. The ultra modern window system helps bring the outside in. The open loft like spaces and exterior courtyards are also a favorite.

### Did you build it from the ground up or was it a reno?

Ground up in seven months.

Love the landscaping. Were you integral to the design or did you hire a landscaper?

Landscaping is one of my passions so this

### with the pandemic? Was it chaos?

It was a scary reality having to leave the city. We all sat down and decided that as we did not have any clear information for planning long term, it was decided that we would all disperse and work remotely. This has now become our way of working and having an office in Manhattan just for large meetings and client interaction if needed. I find this new way of collaborating rather refreshing and we all think productivity has increased this way.

### How has interior design changed to accommodate that period?

I think that living away from the urban centers is more acceptable as a lifestyle, so clients are either relocating or upgrading existing country properties so that the country location is set up for more permanent style living. Kitchen upgrades and larger everything.

### What are some trends that you feel are going out for 2023 and some that are coming in for 2023?

Trends — well, I hope we can be more brave and not follow the usual trends. I am always looking at innovation and hope that design can be inspired by this rather than a style trend. I do, however, hope more modern styling can be embraced.

#### What places, magazines, websites do you refer to to draw inspiration?

The United Kingdom, Europe, and South Africa are my favorite regions where the styles have influenced me.

The movie industry is also one of my favorite ways to enter different worlds and

be inspired — this medium has always excited me. World Of Interiors magazine, Interior Design magazine and Hospitality Design for my industry are great magazines that I am always exploring for history and innovation.

## Do you believe in the famous Hamptons light?

I have been coming to this great area since 1985 — it is truly magical in that the farms and the ocean sprinkled with the beautiful homes and gardens make for one of the most special places in the world. The light is truly a treat for me and I always find myself stopping to take it all in. I love the ocean and bay, and how they affect the East End in so innumerable ways.

For me the Hamptons is about the subtle aspects of what people out here do full time and how there is a history that most of the old families are really proud of. My barber is fifth generation and his grandfather started music at Pierson high school — every time we meet, we talk about his family that hail from Sag Harbor. This, for me, is what keeps the Hamptons set in its ways. I hope it stays this way. Old fashioned and new colliding.

# Mary Waserstein

**Turning The Tables Tastefully**

ary Waserstein was tired of being in the record business. The platters she wanted to spin had roasted sea bass on them. So she wrote a cookbook ("All Things Yum") and started setting the table.

In fact, she set a lot of them. People noticed.

She learned quickly that combining grandma's antique platters with modern Crate & Barrel not only made sense, it looked great. Now she runs a company out of East Hampton, shipping gently used plates, mats, cups, and saucers around the world. The "Martha Stewart of tag sales" goes to all those trash-or-treasure-fests so you don't have to.

We caught up with her rummaging

through china and tchotchkes at the ARF Thrift & Treasure Shop in Sagaponack. Spoiler alert: She's a regular.

#### What's the biggest mistake people make when they plan a dinner party?

Not putting enough on the table. Being overly minimalistic. There's a movement recently toward everything being white. Everything being monochromatic. That's a huge mistake. You want to set an environment people want to stay at. That's not going to happen when everything is sparsely done.

### So what's the big idea here?

You can put things together from different genres. Eclectic is wonderfully interesting and a better dining experience. One of my biggest inspirations was my grandmother. She was incredibly chic and had wonderful taste. I still think about her daily. I'm also very influenced by the British aesthetic of layering in the old with the new and the use of patterns.

### Who needs your help?

tion. And brightly colored and a little different. I want something that has a little "joie" to it. So maybe a piece has a gold edge, or something you haven't seen before.

### What do you love about the East End?

What I love about the Hamptons is the variety of experiences and people. One night you can be having a casual bonfire on the beach and the next a formal dinner party. There is always something to do and the energy is fabulous.

### Are people incredibly intimidated when they invite you to dinner?

Yes. (Laughs.) But oh my gosh, it's such a treat to go to someone else's house. And enjoy dinner there. I absolutely adore it.


